Phase 1 of our program includes computer class, a class in money management, a career development class, as well as GED tutoring if needed! Phase 2 of our program includes a 6-month mentoring program where the student is mentored by a Christian woman in the community and together the two women work on goal-setting and Bible study.

Willowbrook provides lunch once a week each semester for the women (about 15) enrolled in CWJC job-readiness classes. CWJC God Story: The Hand of God in the Life of Sara

Sara dropped out of school in the 9th grade, a decision she regretted, but lived with for a very long time. Because of her past decision, she always encouraged her children to get a good education and stay in school.

As a woman in her late 40's, her own words started to speak to herself. She longed to acquire her GED and complete her education.

One night she turned on the evening news. She saw a lady being interviewed and was intrigued. This lady was connected with a program called Christian Women's Job Corps of Madison County. Sara listened and wrote down the number on the screen. After thinking about it for awhile, Sara called the CWJC office and asked about the program.

It happened - although we know nothing "happens" with God - to be the last day for students to turn in their applications for the semester.

Sara did not live close to Huntsville's downtown, but re-arranged her day and made it to the CWJC office in time to turn in her application. She was the

last one. In a few short days, Sara was interviewed and accepted into the program. She began to attend classes and started studying to one day take her GED.

After the CWJC classes were completed, Sara's tutors thought she was ready to take the actual GED test. Soon she found herself in the testing room. Finally, the results were in.

She passed the GED with flying colors. The CWJC staff rejoiced with her and they all thanked God for her achievement.

Sara has said on many occasions that her renewed relationship with Jesus Christ is the foundation of her life. She attributes this spiritual growth and renewal to CWJC. She definitely sees the hand of God in this part of her life's journey.

Sara began to interview for jobs and was offered a full-time job with benefits one month ago.

Her supervisor has spoken directly with the CWJC staff and says that Sara is an outstanding employee and has a great deal to teach the rest of the associates in the organization.
